3. We embrace the Black Radical Tradition's notion of human rights as a strategy based in the needs and aspirations of the oppressed
4. Human rights struggle requires us to build intersectional movements at all levels of society, from global to local
5. Realizing our rights requires that we work locally and across localities to support real democracy and accountability and promote human rights-based governance in our communities
